A Guide to Local Resources

Step 1: Find a PrEP Provider

Go to www.prelocator.org to search for providers in the St. Louis area. Call to schedule an initial appointment.

Step 2: Arrive at your first PrEP Appointment

1. Arrive for your first appointment.

2. Get tested.

PrEP users need to get an HIV test every 3 months and labs every 6 months. Ask your PrEP provider or primary care doctor if you can get these tests done at their office.

3. Schedule a follow-up appointment.

Schedule your next appointment 1 month after your 1st appointment, then every 3 months after that for the 1st year.

Step 3: Fill your PrEP prescription

Most pharmacies will fill your prescription. These pharmacies offer extra resources:

Step 4: Pay for your PrEP

Have insurance?

Call the number on the back of your health insurance card to find out what services are covered. Ask how much they pay for PrEP medicine, lab testing (and where you can have your lab tests done), and visits to your doctor.

Have insurance & need help paying for care?
